In the late 1920's radio exploded almost overnight into being America's dominant entertainment just as television would do twenty-five years later. We will look at some of the history related to the development of early radio stations like KDKA of Pittsburgh, WJZ of Newark, and WROK in Rockford as well as early networks of CBS, NBC, and ABC. The main characters and programs of radio will be explored through pictures and recordings. In addition to listening and viewing pictures, volunteers will be asked to take part in a simulated serial radio program from the 1930's or 1940's.




